

Younger/Davis Family History

The Younger family had its beginning well over 100 years ago in the Chalk Level Community of Pittsylvania County, Virginia, with the marriage of Ben Younger to Sallie Shelton. From this union, twelve children were born creating the second generation. These children were Mary, Belle, Richard, William, Tabby, Peter, Bettie, Dock, Martin, Raleigh, Jesse, and Esther.

The greatest linking chain in our family history comes through Tabby Younger, creating the third generation. The children of Tabby were Hettie (the oldest), Minnie, Ben, Martin, Maude, Mabel, Alberta, Rebecca, and Inez (the youngest). There are no survivors from the third generation of Ben and Sallie. However, history reveals that a combined total of approximately 800 children from the fourth through the eighth generations are offspring of Ben and Sallie. We are blessed to have represented here today many members from each of these generations.

The Davis family had its beginning with the marriage of Daniel Davis to Katherine Payne on December 25, 1869, in the Brights Community of Pittsylvania County, Virginia. From this union, eight children were born, creating the second generation: Bettie, Sarah (who died at the age of 3), Grant, Leonard, Edward, Harriett, Elmina, and Queen. There are no survivors from this generation.

Grant Davis married Hettie Younger on August 21, 1905, thus linking the two families. From this union, eight children were born: Queen Esther, Sarah, Robert, Motley, Katherine, Mary Eliza, Regina (who died in infancy), and James. Another offspring of Grant was Mary Belle. There are now no survivors from this generation. History reveals that a total of 48 grandchildren, 130 great grandchildren, and over 100 children from the next two generations are offspring of Grant and Hettie.

We are proud of our family. We have risen from slaves and indigent sharecroppers to span many occupations. Within the two families, there are ministers, evangelists, musicians, educators, medical doctors, professionals, technicians, attorneys, entrepreneurs, chefs, mechanics, miners, cosmetologists, realtors, carpenters, Federal and State Government civil servants, homemakers, actors, athletes, military men and women, and many others with a diversity of talents and skills, of whom we are very proud.

One of the greatest undertakings of the Younger/Davis family was the founding and organization of the Younger/Davis Scholarship committee. This committee was the brainchild of one of our fourth-generation family members, Christine Hemingway. The foundation was laid over 100 years ago, but the scholarship committee was formed at our eighth reunion.

Since its inception, it has been very inspirational to our young family members and instrumental in helping to somewhat defray their cost of getting started in college. Family members up to the age of 25 who are entering college for the first time or currently attending college are encouraged to apply. An average of six scholarships are awarded each year. Scholarships are supported through love gifts from family members, friends, and pledges from each area. Our young people are setting the pace for generations to come. We are very proud of their academic and athletic achievements.

Although we have lost some links in the chain that binds us together, the bond grows stronger with each new generation. We pray that our future generations will continue to strengthen these bonds, grow in unity, and strive for the best that life has to offer, while always keeping their eyes on the Lord and abounding in the faith that He will never fail us.



History of the Younger/Davis Scholarship

One of the greatest undertakings of the Younger/Davis family was the founding and organizing of the Younger/Davis Scholarship. The Younger/Davis Scholarship was founded in August 1987, and the first Scholarship awards were made in 1989. It was the brainchild of our own Christine Hemingway with input from many other family members. For twenty years the Younger/Davis Scholarship was limited to undergraduate studies at an accredited college or post high school vocational/technical institutions. In 2011, Ebony (Jackson) Griffin and Marshall Jackson Jr. introduced the Younger/Davis Graduate Program Scholarship and Percy Edward Thomas introduced the Fred Davis Memorial Scholarship. In 2016, Deborah Johnson proposed an initiative to award and assist our Younger/Davis high school seniors in their study abroad enrichment activities. From there, the Younger/Davis High School grant was born.

The Younger/Davis Scholarship is dedicated to providing financial assistance in the form of scholarships to deserving Younger/Davis family members in pursuit of higher education. Scholarships are awarded annually. Awards are based on the availability of funds and there is no limit to the number of awards made each year. Scholarship awards are announced annually during the Family Reunion. The Scholarship is supported through love offerings and fundraisers from family members and friends as well as pledges from each geographical area of the family. We have awarded over 232 scholarships totaling more than \$91,400.00.

Through the generous efforts of many individuals, the Younger/Davis Scholarship Fund is continuing to grow strong. 


